21 22 23 24	Whereas,	The options are a positive or affirming vote (yes), a negative or dissenting vote (no), a prefer not to respond vote, and a skip option that allows voters to skip the question asked; and			
25 26 27 28	Whereas,	Candidates and referendum questions are required to get a majority of votes cast which is defined as 50% of the vote +1; and			
29 30 31 32 33	Whereas,	Title VI Section 4 G of the ASG Code currently states "Candidates for an Executive Office must receive a majority of votes cast in the corresponding election. If no candidate receives a majority vote, a run-off election shall occur"; and			
34 35 36 37	Whereas,	Votes cast for yes, no, and prefer not respond are all calculated into total votes cast while the "Skip Question" option is not; and			
38 39 40 41 42	Whereas,	In two of the past three ASG elections, there have been only two ballot options for the ASG Executive Offices where a simple majority was achieved, but the inclusion of the prefer not to respond option in majority calculation forced a run-off election; and

44	Whereas,	Prefer not to respond and Skip Question both serve the same			
45		purpose on t	he ballot: to give voters the option to abstain		
46		from voting	on the question; and

48	Whereas,	This creates	a voting redundancy that forces unnecessary		
49		run-off elect	ions such as in the general elections of 2018 and		
50		2020; and			
51					
52	Whereas,	The Office of	f Student Activities has no requirements to		
53		include a "Pr	refer not to respond" option or any option that is		
54		taken into ac	count when calculating a majority vote, and		
55		several OSA	staff members have expressed frustration with		
56		the inclusion	of such options; and		
57					
58	Whereas,	No other can	ididate can be added to the ballot once an		
59		election has	begun, therefor one of the original options for		
60		the executive	e office will be elected eventually; and		
61					
62	Whereas,	If Prefer not	to respond and Skip Question were		
63		consolidated	, it would prevent this issue from happening		
64		while still giv	ving students the opportunity to vote yes, no, or		
65		to abstain; a	nd		
66					
67	Whereas,	A consolidat	ion of the Skip Question and Prefer not to		
68		respond opti	ons on ASG Election ballots would ensure that		
69		future election	ons are won by a simple majority vote, similarly		
70		to how local,	state, and national elections operate; then

72	Be it therefore resolved:		That Title VI Section I J be amended to state		
73			"Ballots for a referendum question provide		
74			voters three options which are "yes", "no" and		
75			"skip question""; and

77	Be it further resolved:		That Title VI Section 1 J c. be amended to state		
78			"By selecting" skip question", a voter is		
79			indicating they prefer to abstain from voting on		
80			the question. Selecting "skip question" does not		
81			count as a vote cast and does not factor into		
82			total votes cast. Skip question responses should		
83			not be used when calculating if a majority of		
84			votes was received for the referendum
